ACTIONS

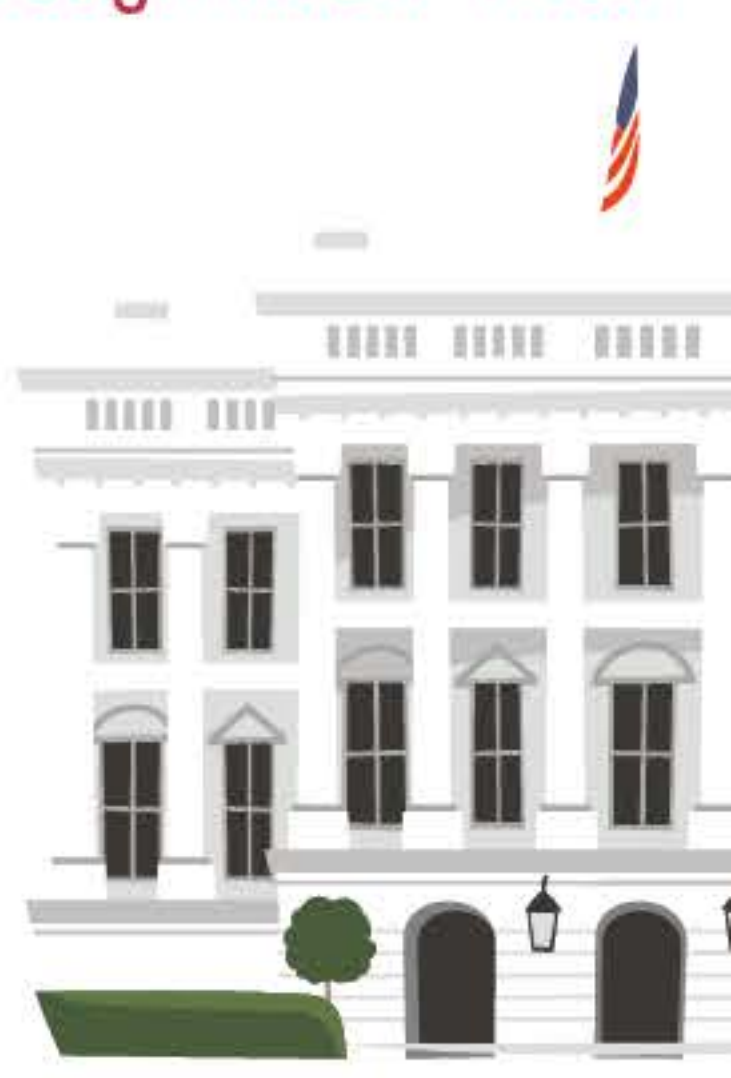
NASW employs a variety of tactics to be heard.
